
In last past year, DVS has added another feather in its hat by addressing the issues of mine workers through a sustainable and inclusive approach. Establishment of silicosis board at Dhoupur to expedite the diagnosis and rehabilitation process is one major achievement this second half of the year.

A model to address the water scarcity in the mining belt by building a check dam through a participatory approach of the community has also witnessed a great learning and success in the chapter of DVS. Adding capacities to workers in organizing themselves and in addressing their issues and to uphold their rights were further scaled up this second half of the year.

DVS under guidance and support of PHF has succeeded in consolidating its social footprint again by organizing a number of health camps, village and block level meetings to improve socioeconomic conditions of the marginalized mine workers and their families.



Demand side activities: Sensitization of community stakeholders

The Daang Vikas Sansthan, Karauli in association with the Tata Trust organized a workshop for block level Sarpanchs and village development officers on "Poshun Jagrut Panchayat" (Nutrition Awareness Panchayat) at the Panchayat Samiti auditorium

The workshop was organized to motivate the Sarpanchs and village development officers in the aspirational districts under the National Nutrition Campaign Panchayat Panchsutra to eradicate undernourishment in gram panchayats and promote and achieve the objectives of the "nutrition campaign" of the Tata Trust under the "National Nutrition Mission" of the Niti Aayog.

It was discussed in the workshop that Sarpanchs and village development officers have an important role to play in achieving this goal

Under the "Make it Happen" program by Rajasthan Tata Trust, it was agreed upon that support of the Women and Child Development department Rajasthan be sought in strengthening the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) in Tonk, Dhaulpur, Alwar, Karauli and Dausa districts.

The participants in the workshop were informed that there are 64,000 Anganwadi centres in Rajasthan and out of which 204 centres are in the above mentioned 5 districts.


Considering the 40 centres in Karauli as model, the Rajasthan government has to develop the remaining Anganwadi centres on the same lines


The Block Development Officers discussed in detail the role of Gram Panchayats in making their areas malnourishment free, facilities available at the Anganwadi centres and how to make sure that it reaches the beneficiaries in the workshop.

A policy was also framed in the workshop to enhance the facilities at the Anganwadi centres so that they become attractive enough for a large number of beneficiaries with a commitment to get them approved in the Gram Sabha meetings for their implementation.

A 5-point poster (panchsutra) on nutrition was also released at the time of culmination of the workshop.

The participants were informed about the role of Anganwadis and the importance of the Panchayati Raj during the workshop.






In view of the unprecedented work in the same sequence, on August 14, 2019, Mr. Rajkumar, Sarpanch, 'Kirbada and Mr. Chhotalal Sarpanch Bardala and two Anganwadi workers Mrs. Santoshi Sen from Karauli district, Matasula and Mrs. Sarvesh Chauhan, Bhandari were honored by the Honorable Deputy Chief Minister, Government of Rajasthan.

Governance and Strengthening

Honourable Dr Manoj Rajoria, Member of Parliament from Dholpur-Karauli, on September 7, 2019, unveiled the "National Nutrition Month" program at Asro Anganwadi Centre of Sankarbada Gram Panchayat of Todabhim Panchayat Samiti and inaugurated 40 model Anganwadi centers run by the Tata Trust for the district function.

The Nutrition Month turned into a mass campaign for community awareness and people's participation.

In the Nutrition Month campaign, the Honorable Member of Parliament took keen interest in the activities of the Tata Trust and departmental activities and gave a message to come together to build a malnutrition-free, healthy and strong India.

Over 500 people, including all members of the Daang Development Institute attended the function.

District Collector visits Anganwadi centre

The then District Collector of Karauli, Sh. Nannumal Pahadiya, visited Bhandari Jatav Basti Anganwadi centre of Todabhim Panchayat Samiti on September 5, 2019. He inaugurated the Anganwadi centre developed by the Tata Trust and visited the model Anganwadi center under the "Let Us Ensure" program.

During the nutrition month, the District Collector participated in community activities at Anganwadi center and discussed vaccination and Mamta card with pregnant women along with facilities and services available at the Anganwadi centre.

At all Anganwadi centers, materials for teaching children through sports and equipment and books for use at Anganwadi centers were taken.

Two- day residential training in Jaipur

A two- day residential training was held at the Institute of Health and Family Welfare, Jhalana Institutional Area, in Jaipur in August.

All DVS cluster co-ordinators, program Coordinator Mr. Rajesh Sharma and Tata Trusts representative and District Program Manager Mr. Shrikant Senapati participated in the training.


It was discussed that TINI is working in 204 Anganwadis in five districts- Dausa, Alwar, Dholpur, Tonk and Karauli. While work is being done in 44 Anganwadis in Tonk, the remaining four districts have 40 Anganwadi each where work is on.

The structure is such that each cluster coordinator has around 8 Anganwadi centres to look after. Each Anganwadi has 8 baby tables, one Tata switch filter for drinking clean water and 9 charts related to children's education.

The details of the facilities available at the Anganwadi- pre-school education, supplementary nutrition, vaccination, health checkup, nutrition and health education and referral service were discussed.

The work of Cluster Coordinators were discussed in detail.Ideas were exchanged and improvements were suggested.

The children and their mothers were given information on nutrition and the benefits of cleanliness, anemia and vaccination were discussed.

Around 40 children and 12 mothers of 3 to 6 years of age from Rajaur and Loharra Anganwadi centres participated in it

On this occasion, 50 kinds of colorful books, pencils, rubber erasers, sharpeners, cutters, height measuring equipment and digital weighing machines were made available at the Anganwadi centre by the Tata Trust to all the children in the Anganwadi centre

Mrs Verma and Mrs Mittal visited Rajaur-3 Anganwadi centre to raise public awareness about the importance of community participation in the Nutrition Month under the nutrition campaign.

Anganwadi workers and assistant training

A two-day residential training of Anganwadi workers and assistants was organized from 28th to 31st August, 2019 at Prakash Hotel Karauli where 34 Anganwadi workers and 38 assistants participated

Anganwadi workers and assistants were taught how to use sports as a development tool for children and how to provide them with higher education with less expense.

GPDP Workshop

On October 1, workshop of Sarpanch and Village Development Officers were held in Panchayat Samiti Auditorium, Karauli in which an action plan was prepared for the Sarpanch and Village Development Officers for the upcoming Graam Sabha meeting

The program co-ordinator explained the inconvenience caused at Aanganbaari centers and suggestions were given for adding the issues of Graam Sabha during the Panchayati training

Posters of "Nutrition Campaign Training Handbook" and "Poshan Ke Panch Sutra "were released.

Sankadbara, Shekhpura, Nisura, Nangal, Sherpur, Matasula, Lapawali, Khedi, Katkad, Kanjoli, Choudagaon, Bhounpur, Bhandari, Andruni, Manchi, Jahangirpur, Ghosla, Banwaripur, Sri Mahaveerji were the villages that participated in the village assembly.

Village Assemblies (Gram Sabha Meeting)

Cluster Coordinators attended village assemblies in which proposals were taken for other Aanganbaari centers along with model Aanganbaari centers

Suggestions of getting electricity connection, water, road construction, building construction, building repair, toilets construction and repair, were taken at Aanganbaari center in these Graam Sabha Meetings

Sankadbara, Shekhpura, Nisura, Nangal, Sherpur, Matasula, Lapawali, Khedi, Katkad, Kanjoli, Choudagaon, Bhounpur, Bhandari, Andruni, Manchi, Jahangirpur, Ghosla, Banwaripur, Sri Mahaveerji were the villages that participated in the village assembly.

Survey of THR distribution and utilization

A survey of 700+ people was conducted on the distribution and usage of THR on Google link by all Cluster Coordinators and uploaded those data directly on Google link.

In this survey, hot food and take home ration which is being given by the government at Aanganbaari center, was conducted with beneficiaries at Aanganbaari centers.

Media Workshop

In November, a media workshop was conducted in collaboration with Mr Ravindra Kushawah, the representative of Tata Trust at Karauli

Ms Shanti Verma-Deputy Director of ICDS, Mr Rajesh Sharma, Mr Vikram Singh Gurjar, Mr Vikram Singh Jatav, Mr Rajkumar Gupta from Daang Vikas Sansthan as well as media like Rajasthan Patrika, Dainik Bhaskar, Dainik Navjyoti, Punjab Kesari, Zee TV, Rajasthan TV, ETV, Aone TV, India News and Rashtradoot participated in the workshop

According to the "Make it Happen" program," Chalo Chalen Anganwadi" campaign was inaugurated. Also, According to the National Nutrition Mission, the target to make 40 Aanganbaari centers malnutrition free in the district was set by Mr Ravindra Kushawah

CDPO Ms Rajeshwari Mittal discussed in detail about the benefits given to the development of children, health check-up of pregnant women, lactating mothers and teenager girls at Aanganbaari center

Information about the Aanganbaari center was conveyed through projectors, posters and movies.

Personnel's capacity building training

In October, a personnel's capacity building training program was conducted by UNICEF and ARAVALI Organisations for the DVS employees at Bansi ke Bagh, Karauli

The training was imparted by Mr Mahesh, Mr Shashank from Action-Aid Organization

The training revolved around understanding of gender, process of socialization, understanding gender-power dynamics, self-identification, problem resolution, communication, future options, laws for security, etc. and pre-training preparation

The importance of focussing on every participant as well as engaging them via games and stories was taught to the participants

Inauguration of "Chalo Chalen Anganwadi" campaign program

Inauguration of "Chalo Chalen Aanganbari" campaign program at Ganvdamina Village of Anganbaari center was organised

In this campaign-"**Anna Prashan**" ceremony day of two children was also celebrated, along with the **Godh Bharai** of pregnant women, the weight and height of 40 children aged seven months to six years were also taken

Discussion on nutritious food, weight, height, vaccination, *Anna Prashan and Godh Bharai* ceremonies, connecting more and more children to Aanganbaari center, cleanliness of the children, mother's milk and nutritious food was conducted

This program was conducted at all other Anganwadi centers in which 1586 divisions participated.

Children's Day

On 14th November, "Children's Day" was celebrated with children at all Aanganbaari centers

Awareness was spread about Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru's vision and love for the children as well as children's rights, nurturing and education

On this occasion, children expressed happiness by reciting poems, stories, sports and counting which help in children's health, mental and physical development.

Nutrition Day

On November 7, Healthy Nutrition Day was celebrated at all Anganwari centers on Healthy Nutrition Day

Information was given about nutrition of children from 7 months to two years along with foster mother and pregnant women

Information about symptoms and prevention of malnutrition, diet of new-borns, adolescent boys and girls was given by the Cluster Coordinators

Pregnant women were advised to pay attention to prenatal check-up and nutrition at least 4 times prior to delivery and also advised to eat varieties of food and to take iron pills. Information about breast feeding and type of diet was also given.

Center visit by Tata Trusts Representatives

Problems were discussed and cluster coordinators were given proper guidance for the prevention of those issues.

A team of cluter coordinators along with the staff of Tata Trusts visited all the centers of Aanganbaari, at Mandagurjar, Narauli, Masavta and Valauti

They talked with the employees, played games with children and took weight and height details.

Capacity Building Training

Two-day residential training was held from Dated 27 to 28 December 2019 at the Institute of Health and Family Welfare, Jhalana Institutional Area, Jaipur

The training was based on the ongoing pre-school education program at Anganwadi center which is imparted by local materials, at least cost.

The participants belonged to Dausa, Alwar, Dholpur, Tonk and Karauli

Other Activities

Regular vaccination and celebration of Godh Bharai, Anna Parashan ceremonies for mothers .

Visits to 100+ homes by Aanganbaari employees to spread awareness among 400+ people bout their activities.

Training of PRI was done on 4.10.19 at Mandrayal in which 6 Sarpanch and 19 village development officers participated.

Rajeevika training was at Todabhimin which 41 women participated.

Flooding during the monsoon was stopped by filling soil and paved roads

FIGHTING SILICOSIS

An experience workshop was conducted on April 18, 2019 at Jaipur by DVS regarding safe mining for state level stone cutting workers.

It saw participation of 32 workers as well as members of 10 organizations and unions from Karauli, Dhaulpur, Ajmer, Bheelbada and Vijoliya regions.

The workshop talked about a device made for safe mining by DVS and whether it could even be used during drilling.

It also talked about the measures taken by the government regarding the security of the workers.

The work done by DVS for the workers was presented. It was told that for workers working since 2008, the organization had arranged a medical test for silicosis and pleaded to state government for their rights.

As a result of this, more than 3700 workers from Karauli, Dhaulpur, Bharatpur and Dusa got tested for silicosis and got a medical certificate made, following which the state government provided an amount of 40 crores to them.

DVS has also been working for their safety for the past 2 years. This includes safety from dust in mines by pouring water, applying oil.

A minimum cost easily accessible device has also been prepared which is being tested on 10 mines in Karauli and Dhaulpur each.

A discussion followed the presentation in which everyone agreed that the tool should be used at a broader level and more study should be done in this regard.


After training by DVS workers, it was used in 3 mines in Vijauliya and following the success, it was used in 10 mines.

DVS was praised both by the head mining engineer of the district as well as the DC for developing the device since it was cheap and useful.

DVS lobbied with the state government and created a **Pneumoconiosis Board** for the timely detection of silicosis.

Creaed a task force at the district and state level for providing help to silicosis patients, developing online records of their treatment and providing social security to their families.

Records of more than 7600 workers were stored in the software and their applications were processed for different schemes.



STRIKE BY WORKERS FOR THEIR RIGHTS

Under the supervision of DVS, Khaan Mazdoor Sfaety Union Karaukli and unions in Dhaulpurheld an indefinite strike for the following demands

Money be given to silicosis sufferers and families who have lost workers to silicosis which is pending since 2016.

The approved amount of 1 crore be distributed as soon as possible.

Families who have lost members due to silicosis be given 1 lakh more than the 3 lakh already distributed.

Inclusion of union members and DVS members into the Mining Foundation Trust.

Living silicosis patients are currently awarded 2 lakhs by the labour department. The mining department should also award 2 lakhs.

Silicosis sufferers must be included in the disabled category and given work under MGNREGA scheme according to their ability.

As per the guidlines of the **Pneumoconiosis Board,** the results of the test must be out in 2 days.

The families of silicosis sufferers must be included in the Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojna .

The compensation amount must be disbursed within a month.

The government must provide insurance to all mine workers.

All certificates of workers proving silicosis must be moved from offline to an online platform
